

#### ITEM IX: PREVIOUS BUSINESS

- City Facility Needs: Mr. Murphy and Ms. Osenbaugh had a discussion with ETC, a survey company to discuss how they could administer a survey to our citizens about the future of the City Hall and Police Department building(s); As discussed in previous meetings, they would like every registered voter (and not just a pool of registered voters) to receive this survey; ETC can monitor the results to ensure no double votes; this survey would focus on questions regarding why the voters voted the way they did in the recent bond election to try and determine why voters did not support the recent bond issue
- Alderman Totton brought up concern about not receiving emails if this was going to be done electronically as she does not use email; ETC had answered that question and in their experience this has been effective way to solicit information; part of the proposed cost includes finding emails for the voters; Alderman Bass shared concern it may come across as spam and some may not open the survey; Mr. Murphy shares there are ways to spread the message by using the water bill insert or social media to mitigate against the unopened surveys; Mayor Johnston shared he feels this would be a good start and a temporary solution and he would like to see things administered in house; Mr. Murphy shared there are survey monkey features that we could do to handle in house, however he would like this survey to be done independently so it doesn't appear biased; The board would be involved in the question/survey question selection process
- Alderman Headley asked if there was a question limit; ETC would like no more than 4 pages of questions; Ms. Osenbaugh reiterated this survey would focus on what happened in the past and not the future
- Mayor Johnston would like to give this company a try since it is relatively inexpensive; Alderman Knox suggested building one in house and they would return the surveys to the auditor; Mayor Johnston would like to have a group of citizens that volunteer to take surveys and provide feedback regularly

    that is a bit high; It is known once the schools max out, it will change

- Roads and potential widening of Main street and other streets up to par to get people to I-70 from the new neighborhoods and if more large apartment complexes, the city may need a way to deal with the traffic flow
- To the east of us now, if looking at future land use map, there are a lot of acres that could be developed going forward and that could be served by rail; it is a possibility; There is potential with the marijuana facility as right now there is the cultivation facility and if it becomes legal at some point in the future there could be potential for other aspects of the business
- The public perception of the city isn't awful, but not always favorable as they do not feel things are transparent and there were things that were not focused on in the past; communication is an issue over the years; this is a commuter city and depending on where you live, you don't get to the other parts of the city and know what is happening there; people want to know what is going on, but they don't go out and attend the meetings or watch recordings after the fact
- People tend to look at the school and fire issues differently than city issues; need to find the reasons to keep people in
- City Staff needs to expand when the City grows and need more people to support all of the services that need to be
- People want a small town feel, but big city amenities and some do not want growth
- Are there cities we aspire to be like or try to model after:
  - Mayor thinks we have a different demographic and Blue Springs is the closest to us; lots of our citizens talk of things they like there and things they haven't liked there
- What type of support does the Board of Aldermen need to do their role:
  - Mayor wants to hear about issues going on that are needed and relevant (ex: public works with new infrastructure will need more people and difficult to hire that position right now)
  - Staff does a good job now asking for things real time; are they holding back on items nervous they will be shot down

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY CODE BY ADDING CHAPTER 660 REGARDING MOBILE FOOD UNITS

**WHEREAS,** the City of Grain Valley is authorized to issue an occupational license in accordance with Chapter 605 of the City Code; and

**WHEREAS,** the City of Grain Valley wishes to continue to support local businesses throughout the Metro Area; and

**WHEREAS,** the Board of Aldermen believes it is in the best interests of the City of Grain Valley and its residents to amend the City Code to regulate Mobile Food Units.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri as follows:

**SECTION 1:** The City Code is hereby amended by adding one new chapter regarding mobile food units, to read as follows:

### Chapter 660 Mobile Food Units

660.010. Definitions

Mobile Food Unit

A food service business that sells prepared food at retail from a movable vehicle (such as a truck), a portable structure with wheels (such as a trailer with wheels), or a pushcart.

### 660.020. Business License Required

- A. All mobile food units are required to be properly licensed under Chapter 605. Those who currently have a license for a brick and mortar store will not be required to obtain an additional occupation license provided the Employer Identification Number (EIN) for both operations is the same.
- B. A business license is not required for the following events:
  - 1. Grain Valley Fair
  - 2. Events administered and/or co-sponsored by the City of Grain Valley

#### 660.030. Business License Issuance

A. No person shall operate a food truck within the city limits unless such person first obtains a business license as provided by Chapter 605.

B. All mobile food units shall comply with all other applicable regulations under Chapter 605 or other Chapters of this Code.

660.040. Permissible Locations for Food Trucks.

Food Trucks may conduct business at the following locations:

- 1. Private property when properly zoned for retail sales with the written permission of property owner.
- 2. Parking lot in a residential district with written permission of property owner and owners of property immediately abutting parked mobile food unit.
- 3. City property designated for this purpose.

### 660.050. Operation Requirements.

Mobile food units licensed under this Chapter shall:

- 1. have a current sanitary inspection from the County Health Department prior to selling any food to the public; and
- 2. be attended at all times, whether serving or not; and
- 3. limit operations to the period between 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.

**SECTION 2:** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

**SECTION 3:** The provisions of this ordinance are severable and if any provision hereof is declared invalid, unconstitutional, or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this ordinance.



### EASEMENT AGREEMENT

THIS EASEMENT AGREEMENT (this "<u>Agreement</u>") is made this \_\_\_\_\_ day of August, 2020, by Habitat-Missouri, L.L.C., having an address of 24820 Miller Road, Harrisonville, Missouri 64701 ("<u>Grantor</u>"), in favor of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri, having an address of 711 Main Street, Grain Valley, Missouri 64029 ("<u>Grantee</u>").

### RECITALS

- A. Grantor is the fee simple owner of that certain real property located in Grain Valley, Jackson County, Missouri, legally described on <u>Exhibit "A"</u> attached hereto (the "<u>Grantor's</u> Property").
- B. Pursuant to that certain Restoration and Trails Contract, dated as of September 9, 2013, by and between Grantor and Grantee (the "<u>Trail Contract</u>"), Grantor agreed to, among other things, grant in favor of Grantee an easement to utilize certain trails and areas ancillary to such trails located upon Grantor's Property (the "<u>Easement Area</u>"; the Easement Area is legally described on <u>Exhibit "B"</u> attached hereto. This Easement Area is for a Trail Spur not included in the Easement Agreement between Grantor and Grantee dated May 29, 2020.
- C. Grantor desires to grant a non-exclusive easement over the Easement Area for the purpose of allowing Grantee to use such trails and areas ancillary thereto, upon the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and in the Trails Contract.

### **AGREEMENT**

### 1.0 **GRANT OF EASEMENT.**

- 1.1 Grantor hereby grants and conveys to Grantee and Grantee's residents, guests, invitees, agents, licensees, successors and assigns a non-exclusive easement for pedestrian and bicycle use and the operation and maintenance of the trails and the ancillary areas associated therewith, located upon the Easement Area (the "Easement").
- 1.2 Grantor reserves for itself and for its guests, invitees, licensees, successors and assigns the right to occupy and utilize the Easement Area, so long Grantor and its guests, invitees, licensees, successors and assigns do so without materially interfering with the right to use, operate and maintain the Easement Area granted to Grantees hereunder.
- 1.3 Grantee may construct such improvements in the Easement Area as are contemplated in the Restoration and Trails Contract between the parties dated September 9, 2013. Grantor will not construct any improvements within the Easement Area without the express written consent of the Grantee. Grantor shall have no obligation to construct or maintain improvements upon any area ancillary to the trails constructed upon the Easement Area or to repair or maintain any portion of the Easement Area under this Agreement.
- 1.4 Neither Grantee, nor its residents, guests, invitees, agents, licensees, successors and assigns, shall remove any improvement or structure located on the Grantors' Property, whether

now or hereafter existing and whether located within the Easement Area or otherwise, for any reason or purpose whatsoever.

1.5 Grantee shall repair, at Grantee's sole cost and expense, any damage or destruction to all or any portion of Grantor's Property, or any other item of property belonging to Grantor, whether real or personal (and whether located within the Easement Area or elsewhere on Grantor's Property), arising from or related to the use of the Easement Area by Grantee, members of the public or Grantee's residents, guests, invitees, agents, licensees, successors and assigns.

### 2.0 TERM.

2.1 The Easement granted herein shall be perpetual in nature and shall be binding upon the successors and assigns of Grantor. The benefit and burden of this Agreement and the covenants and agreements contained herein shall run with the land.

### 3.0 MISCELLANEOUS.

- 3.1 This Agreement may not be modified except in a writing signed by Grantor and Grantee, or their respective successors and assigns.
- 3.2 This Agreement, in conjunction with the Trail Contract, sets forth the complete and entire agreement between Grantor and Grantee concerning the subject matter hereof and of the Trail Contract. Except as set forth herein and in the Trails Contract, there are no covenants, promises, agreements, conditions or understandings, either oral or written, between them with respect to the subject matter hereof and of the Trails Contract other than those set forth herein and therein.
- 3.3 All notices pertaining to this Agreement shall be in writing sent by certified United States mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, or commercial overnight courier that provides tracking and proof of receipt of items mailed and addressed as set forth hereinabove. Each party shall have the right to specify that notice be addressed to any other address by giving the other party written notice thereof. This Agreement will be recorded in the office of the Recorder of Deeds for Jackson County, Missouri. Grantor will bear the cost of such recording.
- 3.4 This Agreement will be governed by, and construed, interpreted and enforced in accordance with, the laws of the State of Missouri.
- 3.5 This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, and all counterparts when taken together shall constitute one and the same original agreement.
- 3.6 The failure of any party to insist upon strict performance of any of the terms, covenants or conditions hereof shall not be deemed a waiver of any rights or remedies that party may have hereunder or at law or equity and shall not be deemed a waiver of any subsequent breach or default in any of such terms, covenants or conditions.





# Traffic Study Conducted at Woodbury and Pecan Streets For a 4-Way Stop Intersection July 2020

#### Background:

The intersection of Woodbury and Pecan is located in Woodbury Subdivision 3<sup>rd</sup> Plat. Woodbury Drive is classified as a residential collector, while Pecan is classified as a residential access street. The intersection is currently controlled with stop signs on Pecan only. The speed limit for both roads is 25 miles per hour (mph).

The City of Grain Valley received a request and petition from Christy Dickson the president of the Woodbury Home Owners Association (HOA) on December 4, 2019 to create a four way stop at the intersection due to the speed of vehicles on Woodbury Drive. An initial study was completed in December 2019. The results of the study were inconclusive as the primary pedestrian generator is a pool at the intersection which was closed for the season. Woodbury has recently become a through street increasing traffic at the intersection and the pedestrians traffic present because the neighborhood pool is located at this intersection creates concerns. Therefore, the study was completed a second time in July 2020.

#### **Data Collection:**

Various parts of the study were conducted at different times. Speed studies were conducted by the Police Department over 18 days from July 3<sup>rd</sup> to July 21<sup>st</sup>. The results of this study indicate that 11,835 vehicles passed through the intersection on Woodbury Drive. The maximum speed recorded was 45 mph and the average speed recorded was 21 mph. Although the average speed recorded was below the speed limit on Woodbury a significant number of vehicles were exceeding 30 mph.

Vehicle and pedestrian counts were taken by engineering staff at the intersection from 6:30 am to 7:30 pm on July 2, 2020. These hours were chosen to make sure that pedestrian traffic and residents leaving and returning from work would be at their highest levels. Data collected from these counts is summarized in the attached table.

Site Distance was measured using As-Built plans for this intersection. The shortest sight distance measured for vehicles entering the intersection on Woodbury as seen from Pecan was 300 feet. This distance was measured for vehicles entering Woodbury from the east and looking south.

#### Standards:

The standards for placing traffic control devises are established by the Federal Highway Administration in the Manual of Uniform Traffic Devices. The manual was last published in 2009 with amendments added in 2012. Chapter 2b. Regulatory Signs, Barricades, and Gates addresses the application of signs. Section 2B.04 addresses Right-of-Way at Intersections. According to this section the use of yield or stop signs should be considered at the intersection of two minor streets or local roads where the intersection has more than three approaches and where one or more of the following conditions exit:

- A. The combined vehicular, bicycle and pedestrian traffic volume entering the intersection from all approaches averages more than 2,000 units per day.
- B. The ability to see conflicting traffic on an approach is not sufficient to allow a road user to stop or yield in compliance with normal right of way rule if such stopping or yielding is necessary; and/or
- C. Crash records indicate that five or more crashes that involve failure to yield the right-of-way at the intersection under normal right-of-way rule have been reported within a 3-year period, or that three or more such crashes have been reported within a two-year period.

This section also states that "Yield or stop signs should not be used for speed control."

Section 2B.07 addresses the use of Multi-Way Stop Applications as requested in this case. Section 2B.07 states that that "The restrictions on the use of stop signs described in Section 2B.04 apply to multi-way stop applications.

The following criteria should be considered in the engineering study for a multi-way stop sign installation:

- A. Where traffic control signals are justified, the multi-way stop is an interim measure for the installation of the traffic control signal.
- B. Five or more reported crashes in a 12-month period that are susceptible to correction by a multi-way stop installation. Such crashed include right-turn and left-turn collisions as well as right angle collisions.
- C. Minimum volumes:
  - 1. The vehicular volume entering from the major street approaches (total of both approaches) averages at least 300 vehicles per hour for any 8 hours of an average day; and
  - 2. The combined vehicular, pedestrian, and bicycle volume entering the intersection from the minor street approaches (total of both approaches) averages at least 200 units for the same 8 hours, with an average delay to minor-street vehicular traffic of at least 30 seconds per vehicle during the highest hour; but
  - 3. If the 85<sup>th</sup> percentile approach speed of the major-street traffic exceeds 40 mph, the minimum vehicular volume warrants are 70% of the values provide in items 1 and 2.
- D. Where no single criterion is satisfied, but Criteria B, C.1 and C.2 are all satisfied to 80% of the minimum values. Criterion C.3 is excluded from this condition.

#### Option:

Other criteria that may be considered in an engineering study include:

- A. The need to control left turn conflicts;
- B. The need to control vehicle/pedestrian conflicts near locations that generate high pedestrian volumes;
- C. Locations where a road user, after stopping, cannot see conflicting traffic and is not able to negotiate the intersection unless conflicting cross traffic is also required to stop; and
- D. An intersection of two residential neighborhood collector (through) streets of similar design and operating characteristics where a multi-way stop control would improve traffic operational characteristics of the intersection.

#### Analysis:

The following is the analysis of the criteria and the data collected.

- The combined vehicular, bicycle, and pedestrian volume entering the intersection from all approaches averages more than 2,000 units per day. Based on the traffic counts collected by the engineering staff on July 2, 2020, 586 units passed through this intersection and based on those counts, the intersection count is estimated at 1,300 units per day. Based on this number the required 2,000 units per day has not been met.
- The ability to see conflicting traffic on an approach is not sufficient to allow a road user to stop or yield in compliance with normal right of way rule if such stopping or yielding is necessary; Sight distance was measured using as-built drawings of the intersection. The minimum distance measured was 300 feet. For a 25 mph speed limit the most restrictive distance is 280 feet for traffic traveling south on Woodbury. The minimum distance measured for traffic traveling north on Woodbury was 360 feet. However, since some of the traffic was recorded traveling over 30 mph the most restrictive sight distance at that speed is 335 feet.
- Crash records indicate that five or more crashes that involve failure to yield the right-of-way at
  the intersection under normal right-of-way rule have been reported within a 3-year period, or
  that three or more such crashes have been reported within a two-year period. A records search
  indicated that no crashes have been recorded at this intersection. Therefore, this criteria does
  not apply.
- Where traffic control signals are justified, the multi-way stop is an interim measure for the installation of the traffic control signal. Since no signal is contemplated at this intersection, this criteria does not apply.
- Five or more reported crashes in a 12-month period that are susceptible to correction by a multiway stop installation. Such crashed include right-turn and left-turn collisions as well as right angle collisions. A records search indicates that no crashes have been recorded at this intersection, so this criteria does not apply.
- The vehicular volume entering from the major street approaches (total of both approaches) averages at least 300 vehicles per hour for any 8 hours of an average day; The average hourly volume recorded during both the morning and evening peak hours was 108 vehicles per hour, so this criteria does not apply.
- The combined vehicular, pedestrian, and bicycle volume entering the intersection from the minor street approaches (total of both approaches) averages at least 200 units for the same 8 hours, with an average delay to minor-street vehicular traffic of at least 30 seconds per vehicle during the highest hour; Based on vehicle counts during the same time period the average units entering the intersection from the minor street (Pecan) was 76, so this criteria does not apply.
- If the 85<sup>th</sup> percentile approach speed of the major-street traffic exceeds 40 mph, the minimum vehicular volume warrants are 70% of the values provide in items 1 and 2. The maximum speed recorded for Woodbury was 45 mph and the 85<sup>th</sup> percentile was 24 mph, so this criteria does not apply.

#### Optional Criteria:

The need to control left turn conflicts; No left turn conflicts were observed.

- The need to control vehicle/pedestrian conflicts near locations that generate high pedestrian volumes; Since a neighborhood pool is located at this intersection which is a high pedestrian generator, pedestrian traffic is in conflict.
- Locations where a road user, after stopping, cannot see conflicting traffic and is not able to negotiate the intersection unless conflicting cross traffic is also required to stop; Sight distance is sufficient for the posted 25 mph speed limit, however, problems arise when vehicles are traveling at or over 30 mph.
- An intersection of two residential neighborhood collector (through) streets of similar design and operating characteristics where a multi-way stop control would improve traffic operational characteristics of the intersection. Pecan is not a residential collector street so this criteria does not apply.

#### **Conclusions and Recommendations:**

Although the intersection doesn't meet all of the requirements for a 4-way stop, it does meet one criteria when the true speed of traffic is considered instead of the speed limit. This criteria is the ability to see conflicting traffic since the minimum sight distance is 300 feet and a significant portion of the traffic exceeds 30 mph. The minimum required sight distance for 30 mph is 335 feet. In addition, the pool located at this intersection is a significant pedestrian generator and causes conflicts with pedestrian traffic. Therefore based on these 2 criteria, I recommend the installation of a 4-way stop intersection.

I also recommend increased enforcement in the area until the intersection can be signed.

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 240, PARKS AND RECREATION, OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, IN SECTION 240.160 SECTION (MERCHANDISING)

**WHEREAS**, the Grain Valley Park Board proposed a text amendment to Chapter 240 to make changes to the Code of Ordinances of the City of Grain Valley for the sale of services and merchandise on park property; and

**WHEREAS**, the existing ordinance was last updated in 1990 and is very broad, lacking detailed information regarding the restrictions for the sale of services and merchandise on park property; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance amendment provides greater detail regarding those restrictions; and

**WHEREAS,** this ordinance amendment gives the Director of Parks and Recreation the authority to evaluate and approve/disapprove all requests to sell merchandise and services on park property; and

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri as follows:

**SECTION 1:** That Chapter 240, Parks and Recreation, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Grain Valley Missouri be amended to include text to read as follows:

#### **Section 240.160 MERCHANDISING**

- A. Solicitation by any individual or organization is strictly prohibited. No person shall sell or offer for sale or advertise any goods, merchandise, or any product, service or other goods, or solicit contributions, or maintain any concession in any City park or City park, parking lot associated therewith, or use any City park facilities or City park property for commercial purposes except as authorized by the Director of Parks and Recreation on behalf of the Park Board or their designee or pursuant to a written agreement with the City of Grain Valley.
  - 1. No person shall erect or place or cause to be erected or placed a stand, building, structure, wagon, tent, vehicle, car, trailer or any other thing to be used for the purpose of selling, dispensing or conveying merchandise, refreshments, service,

food, beverages, sports goods and supplies, or articles or advertisement of merchandise or service of any kind in or upon a City park unless such person has been granted permission by way of a written permit to do so by the Director of Parks and Recreation on behalf of the Park Board or their designee or is doing so pursuant to a written agreement with the City of Grain Valley.

- 2. No person shall use any City park, or sports courts, athletic field, swimming pool, shelter, or facility or portion thereof, owned or leased by the City, for instruction of any sort concerning physical fitness or athletic performance for which a fee is charged by that person, or to operate or conduct individual or group lessons, clinic, fitness programs or to run tournaments for which a fee is charged unless such person has been granted permission by way of a written permit to do so by the Director of Parks and Recreation on behalf of the Park Board or their designee or is doing so pursuant to a written agreement with the City of Grain Valley. This prohibition applies both to the person giving the instruction and the person receiving it. This does not apply to training given by City employees or by persons under a contract or permit with the City as part of a program of the City. This does not apply to coaches of teams playing in City administered leagues or in leagues which have a lease, permit, or user agreement with the City to use a City facility for their sport's use.
- 3. Any person that requests and is issued a permit to sell or dispense any merchandise, refreshments, service, food, beverages, sports goods, or supplies in a City park shall obtain and maintain a current City business license necessary to sell or dispense any merchandise, refreshments, service, food, beverages, sports goods, or supplies pursuant to Chapter 605 and any other required County or State license or permit, and shall provide any required reports and payments to the City, County or State.
- 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or dispense any merchandise, refreshments, service, food, beverages, goods, and supplies in or from any City park for a fee without approval and permit from the Director of Parks and Recreation on behalf of the Park Board or their designee or a valid contract to do so from the City of Grain Valley.
- 5. Events administered and/or co-sponsored by the City of Grain Valley shall be exempt.

**WHEREAS**, the City's Board of Aldermen is authorized pursuant to Section 300.660 RSMo to adopt by ordinance referencing the Model Traffic Ordinance as adopted at Sections 300.010 to 300.600 RSMo; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Aldermen did so adopt the Model Traffic Ordinance by virtue of Ordinance, which is now codified as Title III of the Municipal Code of the City of Grain Valley ("City Traffic Code"); and

**WHEREAS**, Title III, Section 340.240, of the City Traffic Code, entitled "Wearing of Safety Helmet Required," regulates the requirement of wearing helmets while operating or occupying as a passenger any motorcycle upon the streets and highways of the City of Grain Valley ("City"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Missouri Governor signed House Bill 1963 into law easing helmet requirements for motorcyclists in the State of Missouri; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Aldermen now desires to amend Section 340.240 of the City Traffic Code to accurately reflect the new statutory changes.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri as follows:

**SECTION 1**: Section 340.240 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri shall be amended as follows

Section 340.240 Protective Headgear Required, When.

- A. Every person under twenty-six years of age who is operating or riding as a passenger on any motorcycle or motor-tricycle, as defined in Section 300.010, upon any highway or street of this city shall wear protective headgear at all times the vehicle is in motion; except that:
  - 1. Any person twenty-six years of age or older operating any motorcycle or motortricycle who has been issued an instruction permit shall wear protective headgear at all times the vehicle is in motion.
- B. The protective headgear shall meet reasonable standards and specifications established by the director.

- 1. The standards and specifications are those required by Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard (FMVSS) 218. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) established standards for motorcycle helmets to ensure a certain degree of protection in a crash in Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 218. DOT-compliant helmets are helmets that meet this safety standard, while noncompliant helmets are helmets that do not.
- C. Any qualified motorcycle operator who is twenty-six years of age or older may operate a motorcycle or motor-tricycle upon any highway of this state without wearing protective headgear if he or she, in addition to maintaining proof of financial responsibility in accordance with chapter 303 RSMo, is covered by a health insurance policy or other form of insurance which will provide the person with medical benefits for injuries incurred as a result of an accident while operating or riding on a motorcycle or motor-tricycle.
  - 1. Proof of coverage required by Subsection C of this Section shall be provided, upon request by authorized law enforcement, by showing a copy of the qualified operator's insurance card.
- D. No person shall be stopped, inspected, or detained solely to determine compliance with Subsections A, B, and C.
- E. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of an infraction and, upon conviction, shall pay a fine not to exceed twenty-five dollars.
  - 1. Notwithstanding all other provisions of law and court rules to the contrary, no court costs shall be imposed upon any person due to such violation.
  - 2. No points shall be assessed for a failure to wear such protective headgear.

**SECTION 2:** The provisions of this ordinance are severable and if any provision hereof is declared invalid, unconstitutional, or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this ordinance.

**SECTION 3**: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

The existing Grain Valley Ordinance (Section 340.240), which included provisions for the wearing of safety helmet required, is no longer valid because it does not conform to the existing state law. I and Kelly ST. John from the Lauber Law Firm worked to develop the proposed ordinance now being presented for consideration by the Board of Aldermen. Ms. St. John revised the city ordinance to conform to the new Missouri Statute. The proposed ordinance has been placed on the Agenda for the Board of Alderman meeting of September 14<sup>th</sup>, 2020.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF GRAIN VALLEY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>: Section 340.240 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri shall be amended as follows (new text <u>marked in bold and underlined</u>, deleted text *in italies and struck through*):

Section 340.240 Wearing of Safety Helmet Required. Protective Headgear Required, When.

- A. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate or occupy as a passenger any motorcycle on any street, alley or other public place in the City unless such person is equipped with and wearing a helmet which conforms with the following specifications:
- A. Every person under twenty-six years of age who is operating or riding as a passenger on any motorcycle or motor-tricycle, as defined in Section 300.010, upon any highway or street of this city shall wear protective headgear at all times the vehicle is in motion; except that:
  - 1. Any person twenty-six years of age or older operating any motorcycle or motortricycle who has been issued an instruction permit shall wear protective headgear at all times the vehicle is in motion.
  - 1. The helmet shall be constructed essentially in the form of a shell around the head, and shall be constructed to absorb impact energy. The shell shall begin above the eyes, covering the forehead, and be formed over and around the top of the head above a

plane level with the base of the shell covering the forehead. It may be formed around the back and sides of the head.

- B. The protective headgear shall meet reasonable standards and specifications established by the director.
  - 1. The standards and specifications are those required by Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard (FMVSS) 218. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) established standards for motorcycle helmets to ensure a certain degree of protection in a crash in Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 218.   - 2. The shell of the helmet shall have a reasonable smooth external surface, and there shall be no external projections greater than one eighth (1/8) inch above the outer surface thereof, except a clip for goggles or face protector where provided for in the construction.
- C. Any qualified motorcycle operator who is twenty-six years of age or older may operate a motorcycle or motor-tricycle upon any highway of this state without wearing protective headgear if he or she, in addition to maintaining proof of financial responsibility in accordance with chapter 303 RSMo, is covered by a health insurance policy or other form of insurance which will provide the person with medical benefits for injuries incurred as a result of an accident while operating or riding on a motorcycle or motortricycle.
  - 1. Proof of coverage required by Subsection C of this Section shall be provided, upon request by authorized law enforcement, by showing a copy of the qualified operator's insurance card.
  - 3. The helmet shall be made of materials heavy enough to withstand a serious impact and made of a heavy plastic or other durable material that will not deteriorate appreciable when exposed to rain, snow, sleet, sun, cold, dust, vibrations, contact with skin or hair, or with age. The helmet shall be equipped with a harness or chin strap for maintaining its position on the wearer's head. Such helmets shall provide such protective standards as that is approved.
- D. No person shall be stopped, inspected, or detained solely to determine compliance with Subsections A, B, and C.
- E. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of an infraction and, upon conviction, shall pay a fine not to exceed twenty-five dollars.
  - 1. Notwithstanding all other provisions of law and court rules to the contrary, no court costs shall be imposed upon any person due to such violation.
  - 2. No points shall be assessed for a failure to wear such protective headgear.





#### **BOA Staff Report – September 28, 2020**

Final Plat – Valley Subdivision Property Owner/Developer – L&L Development LLC

#### **PURPOSE:**

The purpose of this request is to gain final plat approval for the subdivision.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

This property is approximately sixteen acres in size and is generally located north of Tisha Lane and west of Gateway Court. The proposed subdivision will contain 61 lots. The property is zoned District R-1 (Single Family Residential District). The Board of Aldermen approved Ordinance 2432 on April 9, 2018 changing the zoning from Agricultural to R-1.

#### **ANALYSIS:**

The final plat has slightly changed from the preliminary plat. There is no longer a detention basin needed. The stormwater will drain through the Tract A in the final plat and disperse the water onto the wetland area to the north.

Since Tract A is smaller than the original detention basin, the developer was able to add an additional lot. The preliminary plat had 60 lots and the final plat contains 61 lots.

The numbering of the lots also changed in relation to the location of the FEMA flood Zone AE. The lots on the Final Plat that are within the Flood Zone AE are 11, 12,13,14 and 15. The final plat includes on these lots as well as 10 and 16 the base flood elevation for a 0.2% annual chance of flood which is also commonly know as the 500 year flood.

Regarding the Planning and Zoning condition for preliminary plat approval, the lowest floor of the residence on lots 11, 12, 13, 14 and 15 must be above the base flood elevation shown on the final plat for that lot.

The sewer main has been relocated.

The final plat is in conformance with City Standards and engineering civil plans have been approved by City Engineer and a construction permit for the infrastructure has been issued.

#### **PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION:**

The Commission, at their September 9, 2020 meeting, voted unanimously to recommend approval on the Final Plat.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**







# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE V OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO INCLUDE A NEW CHAPTER ADDRESSING CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTORS

**WHEREAS,** the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley deems it in the best interest of the citizens of the City to amend the Municipal Code of Ordinances to set insurance requirements for Construction Contractors doing business within the city limits.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri as follows:

**SECTION 1:** That Title V of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Grain Valley be amended to include a new chapter, Chapter 520 to read as follows:

#### **CHAPTER 520 – CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTORS**

#### SECTION 520,010 DEFINITIONS

As used in this title, the following words shall have the following definitions:

"CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTING" refers to the activity of a construction contractor.

"CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTOR" means a person who undertakes to or offers to undertake to, or purports to have the capacity to undertake to, or submits a bid to, or does himself or by or through others, construct, alter, repair, add to, subtract from, improve, move, wreck, or demolish any building, highway, road, railroad, excavation, or other structure, project, development, or improvement to real property, or to do any part thereof.

"Construction contractor" includes subcontractors, specialty contractors, prime contractors, and any person receiving consideration for the general supervision and/or coordination of such a construction project except for remediation contracting. This definition shall govern without regard to whether or not the construction contractor is acting in fulfillment of a contract.

### SECTION 520.020 PERMIT REQUIRED FOR BUILDING CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTORS

- A. No person shall hold himself or herself out as a Construction Contractor or offer to provide Construction Contracting in the City until such person has obtained an occupational license.
- B. All contractors shall maintain general liability coverage in an amount no less than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) per occurrence for personal injuries and property damage. In addition, every such contractor shall procure and maintain workers' compensation insurance as required by law. Proof of insurance shall be provided at the time of licensure and shall have the City of Grain Valley added as a certificate holder to the insurance policy. The insurance policy shall require the insurance company to notify the City of Grain Valley in writing any change or cancellation of such policy at least ten (10) days prior thereto. In addition to the aforementioned insurance requirements, any licensed contractor performing work in the City right-of-way as a condition of a building permit must meet the bonding requirements set forth in Section 505.080, Bond Prerequisite To Issuance.

**SECTION 2:** This ordinance will be effective immediately upon final passage and approval.

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE V OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO INCLUDE A NEW CHAPTER ADDRESSING LANDLORDS AND RENTAL PROPERTIES

**WHEREAS,** the Board of Aldermen of the City has determined it to be in the best interest of the citizens of Grain Valley to amend Title V to include a chapter regulating landlords and rental properties; and

**WHEREAS,** to provide authority to the City of Grain Valley, Missouri to authorize and issue landlord registrations.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri as follows:

**SECTION 1:** That Title V of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Grain Valley be amended to include a new chapter, Chapter 515 to read as follows:

#### **CHAPTER 515 - LANDLORDS**

#### **SECTION 515.010 DEFINITIONS.**

As used in this title, the following words shall have the following definitions:

**LANDLORD** means a person who leases, or agrees to lease, a rental unit for a period of more than thirty (30) days.

**RENTAL UNIT** means a dwelling unit that is offered for rent, lease, or hire or which is rented leased or hired, regardless of whether the occupant has actually paid any rent. If multiple dwelling units are in a single building (such as a duplex or triplex or an apartment building) each dwelling unit is a separate Rental Unit.

**TENANT** means the person or persons occupying a Rental Unit with the consent of the owner or manager of the Rental Unit.

#### SECTION 515.020 LANDLORD REGISTRATION.

- A. No person shall rent to another for occupancy any rental unit, or allow any such rental unit to be occupied by another without first registering as a landlord with the city.
- B. The registration shall be on a form prescribed by the City Administrator, or his or her designee, and shall include:
  - 1) The location of all Rental Units leased or offered for lease by the Landlord, and
  - 2) A contact person for the Rental Unit who lives within the City or within the Greater KC area including a contact number or numbers where the contact person may be reached at any time.
- C. Except as otherwise specifically provided, Landlord registrations shall be valid, for the registration year beginning July first (1st) and end June thirtieth (30th). All such registrations shall be due and payable on or before July first (1st) of each year. Any Person whose registration has expired shall immediately cease doing business until a new permit is issued.
- D. No registration shall be issued until payment of the appropriate fee imposed to cover the City's costs in processing the registrations as well as implementing and maintaining this program. The fee is set forth in the Comprehensive Fee Schedule.
- E. If a registration expires and is not renewed within thirty (30) days, the City Administrator, or his or her designee, shall report the same to the City Prosecutor.
- F. No city-owned or controlled utilities will be turned on for any residential dwelling unit, which is not owner-occupied or which is not registered as a rental unit according to this Section.

**SECTION TWO:** This ordinance will be effective as of October 12, 2020.

#### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 605 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GRAIN VALLEY, MISSOURI, PERTAINING TO OCCUPATIONAL LICENSES

**WHEREAS,** Chapter 605, Code of Ordinances, City of Grain Valley, Missouri sets the regulations for Occupational Licenses within City limits;

**WHEREAS**, the Chapter has been reviewed and amended to provide clarity, consistency and to reflect current practices followed.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri as follows:

**SECTION 1:** The City Code is hereby amended by repealing Chapter 605 and enacting in lieu thereof one new Chapter, to read as follows:

#### CHAPTER 605- OCCUPATIONAL LICENSES

Cross References — Alcoholic beverage licenses, §600.170 et seq.; dangerous animal permit, §210.050; permits for cats and dogs, §210.160 et seq.; fireworks permits, §220.110; flood control development permits, ch. 415; solid waste collection and disposal permits, §235.190 et seq.; park permits, §410.130; proper display of vehicle license plates, §390.010; vehicle registration, title and licenses, §390.010 et seq.; angle loading permits, §350.020; curb loading permits, §360.020 et seq.; excess weight permits, §382.070; permits for use of parks, §240.170; street excavation permit, §505.050 et seq.; parade permit, §347.030 et seq.; private sewage disposal system permit, §705.320.

### SECTION 605.010 ENACTING AUTHORITY — TITLE — APPLICATION — EXEMPTIONS. [Code 1985, §52.010; CC 1990 §12-26]

Pursuant to authority granted by Section 94.270, RSMo., as amended, this Chapter is hereby established and shall be known as the "Occupational Licensing Code" of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri, a municipal corporation, and shall apply to all corporations, companies, associations, joint-stock associations, partnerships, co-partnership and persons and/or their lessees, duly constituted trustees or receivers, heirs, administrators or assigns, who shall engage in any business, trade, vocation, profession

#### SECTION 605.020 DEFINITIONS.

#### [Code 1985, §52.020(3)-(5); CC 1990 §12-27]

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this Chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this Section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

#### **EMPLOYEE**

Any person, as hereinafter defined, who shall apply for and obtain a license under the terms and/or provisions of this Chapter and in accordance therewith.

#### **MANUFACTURER**

Every person who shall hold or purchase personal property for the purpose of adding to the value thereof by any process of manufacturing, or by the combination of different materials, or shall sell or purchase manufactured articles such as are manufactured by it, or such as are used in manufacturing.

#### **PERSON**

Every natural person, firm, partnership, copartnership, corporation, company, association, joint-stock association and/or their lessees, duly constituted trustees or receivers, heirs, administrators or assigns.

#### SECTION 605.030 LICENSE REQUIRED.

It shall be unlawful for a person to operate a business within the city without first having obtained a valid business license or permit. It shall be unlawful for a person to continue to operate a business after the expiration of the license unless a new license has been issued.

- (1) Advertising or soliciting constitutes engaging in business. For purposes of this section, "advertising" means the use of any handbill, billboard, sign, newspaper, radio, loudspeaker, television, telephone listing, computer listing, or other message or device whereby the services or products are offered to the public. The listing in an advertisement of an address which is inside the city or a telephone number associated with the business shall constitute prima facie evidence that the person is engaged in the business activity that is being advertised. It shall be unlawful for any person who is required by the provisions of this chapter to secure a license to advertise the activity without first securing such a license.
- (2) It shall be unlawful for any person who is required by the provisions of this chapter to have a license in order to engage in the licensed activity to solicit, to accept consideration, or to offer the services or products to the public without first securing a license.

### SECTION 605.050 LICENSES — FOR EACH BUSINESS ENTITY. [Code 1985, §52.100; CC 1990 §12-30]

A separate license shall be obtained for each separate legal business entity conducted, operated, maintained, or carried on by every person engaged in any business or manufacturing for which a license is required by this Chapter.

### SECTION 605.060 BUSINESSES AND OCCUPATIONS REQUIRING A LICENSE. [Code 1985, §52.190; CC 1990 §12-31]

The terms 'business or manufacturing' or 'business' as used in this Chapter shall include all of the businesses and occupations listed in Section 94.270, RSMo. or any similar provision. The businesses and occupations listed herein shall be construed broadly to include any substantially similar business or occupation regardless of the current title of such business or occupation, and specifically including the following:

SECTION 605.065 BUSINESSES AND OCCUPATIONS NOT REQUIRED TO HAVE A LICENSE. The following businesses shall be exempt from city license requirements:

Plumbers and all other business, trades, and avocations whatsoever

Public masquerades

Pistol galleries

- (1) Any minister of the gospel, duly accredited Christian Science practitioner, teacher, a professor in a college, priest, lawyer, certified public accountant, dentist, chiropractor, optometrist, chiropodist, physician, or surgeon.
- (2) Any insurance agent or broker, veterinarian, architect, professional engineer, land surveyor, auctioneer, or real estate broker or real estate salesman, unless that person maintains a business office within the city limits.
- (3) Any farmer or producer of produce raised by him/her, when sold from his/her wagon, cart, vehicle, or stand, or any person in the employ of such farmer or producer.
- (4) Any additions or deletions to this list as required by state law.

#### SECTION 605.070 APPLICATION FOR LICENSE.

- (1) All applications for licenses provided for in this Chapter shall be filed with the City Clerk. The Board of Aldermen shall prescribe the form of application and license form. Except as otherwise provided, all licenses issued under this Chapter shall be signed by the Mayor and the City Clerk and shall be invalid for all purposes unless so signed.
- (2) No application shall be issued unless and until all personal taxes, merchant taxes, manufacturing taxes, other license fees, inspection fees, or any other financial obligations which are delinquent and owing to the City, have been paid. No license provided for or required under this Chapter, or any other ordinance of the City shall be issued by any department until compliance with this Section has been fulfilled.
- (3) No license shall be issued unless the location of the proposed business or occupation shall comply in every respect with the zoning and/or other ordinances of the City. On all new applications, the Community Development Director and Building Inspector shall certify that the premises meet minimum code standards as established by the City, before issuance of such license.
- (4) No license shall be issued until payment of the appropriate license fee as set forth in the Comprehensive Fee Schedule.
- (5) Upon receipt of a valid application and the accompanying fee, the mayor and city clerk shall sign the license and the City Clerk shall issue the business license, or renew the business license, within fifteen (15) days. If a license is denied, the City Clerk shall provide the applicant with a statement of the reasons for the denial. (State reference § 94.230)

### SECTION 605.090 YEAR — WHEN DUE AND PAYABLE — LATE PENALTY. [Code 1985, §52.060; CC 1990 §12-34; Ord. No. 1170 §1, 3-9-1998; Ord. No. 2295 §1, 5-22-2013]

- A. Except as otherwise specifically provided, the license year for all business or manufacturer licenses issued under this Chapter shall begin July first (1st) and end June thirtieth (30th). All such licenses shall be due and payable on or before July first (1st) of each year. Any Person whose business license has expired shall immediately cease doing business until a new license is issued.
- B. The City Clerk shall add to the amount due ten percent (10%) licenses not renewed on or before July 1<sup>st</sup>, but which are reinstated within 30 days of expiration and an additional five percent (5%) penalty for each month thereafter that such license tax fee remains delinquent and a business, trade, occupation, or service occupation is conducted within the City, up to a thirty percent (30%) maximum penalty. This penalty shall be in addition to all other penalties which may be imposed by law or ordinance. Nothing in this section shall be construed to allow any business to operate after the expiration of its license.

### SECTION 605.100 VALIDATION RECEIPT — ISSUANCE OR DENIAL — COMPLIANCE WITH ZONING, OTHER ORDINANCES.

#### [Code 1985, §52.070; CC 1990 §12-35; Ord. No. 2056, 11-23-2009]

A. If, for good cause shown, the City Clerk shall disapprove the application for a license under the provisions of this Chapter, or shall fail to act upon same within fifteen (15) days from the date of filing such application, the applicant may within thirty (30) days following the date of disapproval, submit a

written appeal to the Board of Aldermen as hereinafter provided, with the right of hearing, by filing same with the City Clerk who shall thereupon docket such appeal with the Board of Aldermen for consideration and decision at a regular or special meeting of the Board not less than thirty (30) days subsequent to such filing.

### SECTION 605.110 RECORDS OF ISSUANCE. [Code 1985, §52.080; CC 1990 §12-36]

It shall be the duty of the City Clerk to keep a complete and accurate record of all licenses issued under this Chapter, showing the nature of the license, its date of issuance, to whom issued, and the amount of the fee collected therefor.

### SECTION 605.120 DISPLAY. [Code 1985, §52.090; CC 1990 §12-37]

All licenses issued by the City under this Chapter shall be carefully preserved and prominently displayed in a conspicuous manner in the place of business authorized to be conducted by such licensee.

### SECTION 605.130 CHANGE OF LOCATION — NON-TRANSFERABLE TO ANOTHER PERSON. [Code 1985, §52.110; CC 1990 §12-38]

- A. A license may be amended to authorize the conduct of the same business or manufacturing at a different location, provided the control of same remains in the same person or business entity, upon filing with the City Clerk an amended application, within fifteen (15) days of the change, showing the change of address. It shall also be compulsory that Subsection 605.070.3 be complied with in respect to the new location and premises.
- B. A license issued to any person under the provisions of this Chapter shall not be transferable from one person to another person in the event of a change of ownership.

### SECTION 605.140 PROCEDURE WHEN THERE IS MORE THAN ONE BUSINESS AT SAME ADDRESS.

[Code 1985, §52.120; CC 1990 §12-39]

Whenever any person making an application for a license under the provisions of this Chapter is engaged in more than one (1) business, which are not operated as a separate legal business entity, at the same address, such person shall combine the information for all businesses conducted at the same address, as required for the purpose of determining the license fee, the same as if all were conducted as a single business operation.

### SECTION 605.165 OUTDOOR ADVERTISING STRUCTURES — LICENSE FEE. [Ord. No. 1319 §1, 4-24-2000]

The City of Grain Valley, after submitting to the voters of the City and receiving their approval, does hereby adopt a business tax to regulate outdoor advertising structures equal to two percent (2%) of the gross annual revenues derived from the operation of each outdoor advertising structure within the City.

### SECTION 605.170 REFUNDS PROHIBITED. [Code 1985, §52.150; CC 1990 §12-42]

No claims for refund shall be allowable under this Chapter.

### SECTION 605.180 FALSE STATEMENTS IN APPLICATIONS. [Code 1985, §52.160; CC 1990 §12-43]

- A. No person shall knowingly make a false statement in his/her application for a license as to any conditions or factors upon which the license fee is or shall be based.
- B. Any person found making a false statement in his/her application for a license, or knowingly making a false statement as to any condition or factor upon which the license fee is or shall be based, the effect of which was or would be to reduce the amount of such fee, shall in addition to all other penalties now provided by law, pay to the City Clerk, upon demand therefor, the additional amount of license fee found to be due, plus a penalty of twenty-five percent (25%) of such additional fee together with interest on the additional license fee of one percent (1%) per month, after the date when the original license fee was due and payable; and any license theretofore issued to any such person shall be subject to suspension or revocation if so determined by the Board of Aldermen.

### SECTION 605.190 SUSPENSION, REVOCATION. [Code 1985, §52.170; CC 1990 §12-44]

- A. The Board of Aldermen shall have the power to suspend or revoke any license granted under the terms and provisions of this Chapter whenever it shall be shown, or whenever they have knowledge that a licensee is conducting said business or manufacturing in violation of any ordinance of the City. The Board of Aldermen shall have the power to issue subpoenas and all necessary processes and to require the production of papers, to administer oaths and to take testimony and to make findings thereon.
- B. The Board of Aldermen shall not suspend any license issued under this Chapter for a period in excess of sixty (60) days.
- C. Where the action of suspension or revocation is to be taken pursuant to this Chapter, the licensee shall have five (5) days written notice of the Board of Aldermen's intention to suspend or revoke the license prior to the hearing on such suspension or revocation. Such written notice shall be directed by certified or registered U.S. Mail to the business address of the licensee on such licensee's application on file in the office of the City Clerk and shall specify the grounds upon which the license is sought to be suspended or revoked.
- D. The licensee shall have full right to be represented by counsel at such hearing, to produce witnesses in his/her behalf, and any such hearing, as herein provided, shall be before the Board of Aldermen.

### SECTION 605.200 VIOLATIONS, PENALTIES. [Code 1985, §52.180; CC 1990 §12-45]

- A. Any person engaging in any business or manufacturing as herein provided, without first paying the license fee and securing a license therefor, as required by this Chapter or any person violating any other provisions of this Chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to punishment as provided in Section **100.110** of this Code.
- B. Any person violating any order of the Board of Aldermen of suspension or revocation issued pursuant to Section **605.200** by continuing to engage in business or manufacturing during the term of suspension or

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY CODE IN REGARD TO BUSINESS AND OCCUPATIONAL LICENSES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF GRAIN VALLEY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1**. The City Code is hereby amended by repealing Chapter 605 and enacting in lieu thereof one new Chapter, to read as follows:

### Chapter 605 Occupational Licenses

Cross References — Alcoholic beverage licenses, §600.170 et seq.; dangerous animal permit, §210.050; permits for cats and dogs, §210.160 et seq.; fireworks permits, §220.110; flood control development permits, ch. 415; solid waste collection and disposal permits, §235.190 et seq.; park permits, §410.130; proper display of vehicle license plates, §390.010; vehicle registration, title and licenses, §390.010 et seq.; angle loading permits, §350.020; curb loading permits, §360.020 et seq.; excess weight permits, §382.070; permits for use of parks, §240.170; street excavation permit, §505.050 et seq.; parade permit, §347.030 et seq.; private sewage disposal system permit, §705.320.

Section 605.010 Enacting Authority — Title — Application — Exemptions. [Code 1985, §52.010; CC 1990 §12-26]

Pursuant to authority granted by Section 94.270, RSMo., as amended, this Chapter is hereby established and shall be known as the "Occupational Licensing Code" of the City of Grain Valley, Missouri, a municipal corporation, and shall apply to all corporations, companies, associations, joint-stock associations, partnerships, co-partnership and persons and/or their lessees, duly constituted trustees or receivers, heirs, administrators or assigns, who shall engage in any business, trade, vocation, profession; specifically-excepting those professions or callings exempted from license requirements by virtue of Section 71.620, RSMo., as amended, the same being as follows: ministers of the gospel, duly accredited Christian Science-practitioners, teachers, professors in a college, priests, lawyers, certified public accountants, dentists, chiropadists, or physicians or surgeons in the State.

Section 605.020 **Definitions.** [Code 1985, §52.020(3)-(5); CC 1990 §12-27]

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this Chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this Section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

### **EMPLOYEE**

Any person, as hereinafter defined, who shall apply for and obtain a license under the terms and/or provisions of this Chapter and in accordance therewith.

### MANUFACTURER

Every person who shall hold or purchase personal property for the purpose of adding to the value thereof by any process of manufacturing, or by the combination of different materials, or shall sell or purchase manufactured articles such as are manufactured by it, or such as are used in manufacturing.

### **PERSON**

Every natural person, firm, partnership, copartnership, corporation, company, association, joint-stock association and/or their lessees, duly constituted trustees or receivers, heirs, administrators or assigns.

Section 605.030 **Business** — **What Constitutes.** [Code 1985, §52.020; CC 1990 §12-28]

Every person who shall deal in the selling of any goods, wares, merchandise, or services; or who shall, as a practice in the conduct of such business, trade, vocation, profession or occupation, make or cause to be made, any wholesale or retail sales of goods, wares, merchandise, or services to any person or association of persons, shall be classified as a "business" whether such sales are accommodation sales, made from a stock of goods on hand, or by ordering from another source, or by listing, and whether the subject of such sales or services are similar or different than the type, if any, regularly offered or performed by such seller.

Section 605.040 **Required Generally.** [Code 1985, §52.030; CC 1990 §12-29]

There are hereby levied license fees as hereinafter provided in this Chapter, due and payable from any and all persons engaged in any business or manufacturing within the City, and as contemplated by this Chapter, and no such person shall engage in any such business or manufacturing without first having obtained a license therefor, paying such license fee, and registering such business or manufacturing with the City Clerk.

Section 605.030 License required.

It shall be unlawful for a person to operate a business within the city without first having obtained a valid business license or permit. It shall be unlawful for a person to continue to operate a business after the expiration of the license unless a new license has been issued.

- (1) Advertising or soliciting constitutes engaging in business. For purposes of this section, "advertising" means the use of any handbill, billboard, sign, newspaper, radio, loudspeaker, television, telephone listing, computer listing, or other message or device whereby the services or products are offered to the public. The listing in an advertisement of an address which is inside the city or a telephone number associated with the business shall constitute prima facie evidence that the person is engaged in the business activity that is being advertised. It shall be unlawful for any person who is required by the provisions of this chapter to secure a license to advertise the activity without first securing such a license.
- (2) It shall be unlawful for any person who is required by the provisions of this chapter to have a license in order to engage in the licensed activity to solicit, to accept consideration, or to offer the services or products to the public without first securing a license.


Section 605.050 Licenses — for Each Business Entity. [Code 1985, §52.100; CC 1990 §12-30]


A separate license shall be obtained for each separate legal business entity conducted, operated, maintained, or carried on by every person engaged in any business or manufacturing for which a license is required by this Chapter.

Section 605.060 Businesses and Occupations Requiring a License. Representative Listing of Manufacturers, Businesses.

[Code 1985, §52.190; CC 1990 §12-31]

The terms 'business or manufacturing' or 'business' as used in this Chapter shall include all of the businesses and occupations listed in Section 94.270, RSMo. or any similar provision. The businesses and occupations listed herein shall be construed broadly to include any substantially similar business or occupation regardless of the current title of such business or occupation, and specifically including the following: The following is a representative listing of the types of manufacturers and/or businesses to which the terms and provisions of this Chapter shall apply as allowed by Section 94.270, RSMo., as amended, but the Board of Aldermen shall have the power to amend the listings, upon proper passage of amendments to this Chapter, and as allowed by the legislature of the State. However, the omission of a listing for specific type of manufacturer and/or business shall not be construed as exempting such person from obtaining a license in accordance with the terms and provisions of this Chapter.

Nothing in this Chapter shall be construed as authorizing any person to sell intoxicating or non-intoxicating liquors by virtue of such a license.

### Section 605.065 Businesses and Occupations Not Required to Have a License.

The following businesses shall be exempt from city license requirements:

- (1) Any minister of the gospel, duly accredited Christian Science practitioner, teacher, a professor in a college, priest, lawyer, certified public accountant, dentist, chiropractor, optometrist, chiropodist, physician, or surgeon.
- (2) Any insurance agent or broker, veterinarian, architect, professional engineer, land surveyor, auctioneer, or real estate broker or real estate salesman, unless that person maintains a business office within the city limits.
- (3) Any farmer or producer of produce raised by him/her, when sold from his/her wagon, cart, vehicle, or stand, or any person in the employ of such farmer or producer.
- (4) Any additions or deletions to this list as required by state law.

### Section 605.070 Application for License

- (1) All applications for licenses provided for in this Chapter shall be filed with the City Clerk. The Board of Aldermen shall prescribe the form of application and license form. Except as otherwise provided, all licenses issued under this Chapter shall be signed by the Mayor and the City Clerk and shall be invalid for all purposes unless so signed.
- (2) No application shall be issued unless and until all personal taxes, merchant taxes, manufacturing taxes, other license fees, inspection fees, or any other financial obligations which are delinquent and owing to the City, have been paid. No license provided for or required under this Chapter, or any other ordinance of the City shall be issued by any department until compliance with this Section has been fulfilled.
- (3) No license shall be issued unless the location of the proposed business or occupation shall comply in every respect with the zoning and/or other ordinances of the City. On all new applications, the Community Development Director and Building Inspector shall certify that the premises meet minimum code standards as established by the City, before issuance of such license.
- (4) No license shall be issued until payment of the appropriate license fee as set forth in the Comprehensive Fee Schedule.
- (5) Upon receipt of a valid application and the accompanying fee, the mayor and city clerk shall sign the license and the City Clerk shall issue the business license, or renew the business license, within fifteen (15) days. If a license is denied, the City Clerk shall provide the applicant with a statement of the reasons for the denial. (State reference § 94.230)

Section 605.070 Payment of Other Obligations Prerequisite. [Code 1985, §52.040; CC 1990 §12-32]

It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a business of manufacture, engage in a trade, vocation, profession or occupation unless and until all personal taxes, merchant taxes, manufacturing taxes, other license fees, inspection fees, or any other financial obligations which are delinquent and owing to the City, have been paid. No license provided for or required under this Chapter, or any other ordinance of the City shall be issued by any department until compliance with this Section has been fulfilled.

All applications for licenses provided for in this Chapter shall be filed with the City Clerk. The Board of Aldermen shall prescribe the form of application and license form. Except as otherwise provided, all licenses issued under this Chapter shall be signed by the Mayor and the City Clerk and shall be invalid for all purposes unless so signed.

Section 605.090 Year — When Due and Payable — Late Penalty. [Code 1985, §52.060; CC 1990 §12-34; Ord. No. 1170 §1, 3-9-1998; Ord. No. 2295 §1, 5-22-2013]

- A. Except as otherwise specifically provided, the license year for all business or manufacturer licenses issued under this Chapter shall begin July first (1st) and end June thirtieth (30th). All such licenses shall be due and payable on or before July first (1st) of each year. Any Person whose business license has expired shall immediately cease doing business until a new license is issued.
- B. The City Clerk shall add to the amount due ten percent (10%) <u>licenses not renewed on or before July 1<sup>st</sup>, but which are reinstated within 30 days of expiration for the first month that such license tax fee remains delinquent and an additional five percent (5%) penalty for each month thereafter that such license tax fee remains delinquent and a business, trade, occupation, or service occupation is conducted within the City, up to a thirty percent (30%) maximum penalty. This penalty shall be in addition to all other penalties which may be imposed by law or ordinance. <u>Nothing in this section shall be construed to allow any business to operate after the expiration of its license.</u></u>
- C. Any occupational licenses not renewed by July fifteenth (15th) of each year will be subject to penalty as noted in Section 605.090(B).

Section 605.100 Validation Receipt — Issuance or Denial — Compliance With Zoning, Other Ordinances.

[Code 1985, §52.070; CC 1990 §12-35; Ord. No. 2056, 11-23-2009]

- A. All licenses required by this Chapter shall not be issued until a "validation receipt" is issued by the City Clerk. If, for good cause shown, the City Clerk shall disapprove the application for a license under the provisions of this Chapter, or shall fail to act upon same within fifteen (15) days from the date of filing such application, the applicant may within thirty (30) days following the date of disapproval, submit a written appeal to the Board of Aldermen as hereinafter provided, with the right of hearing, by filing same with the City Clerk who shall thereupon docket such appeal with the Board of Aldermen for consideration and decision at a regular or special duly convened meeting of the Board not less than seven (7)thirty (30) days subsequent to such filing.
- B. It is further provided that all licensees, as contemplated by this Chapter, shall comply in every respect with the zoning and/or other ordinances of the City. On all new applications the Community-Development Director and Building Inspector shall certify that the premises meet minimum code standards as established by the City, before issuance of such license.
- C. Upon approval of the application, as herein provided, it shall be the duty of the City Clerk to collect the required license fee and to issue a proper "validation receipt" therefor prior to issuance of the license. It shall be the duty of the City Clerk to issue all licenses upon proof of validation.
- D. Nothing in this Chapter shall be construed as authorizing any person to sell intoxicating or non-intoxicating liquors by virtue of such license.

Section 605.110 **Records of Issuance.** [Code 1985, §52.080; CC 1990 §12-36]

It shall be the duty of the City Clerk to keep a complete and accurate record of all licenses issued under this Chapter, showing the nature of the license, its date of issuance, to whom issued, and the amount of the fee collected therefor.

Section 605.120 **Display.** [Code 1985, §52.090; CC 1990 §12-37]

All licenses issued by the City under this Chapter shall be carefully preserved and prominently displayed in a conspicuous manner in the place of business authorized to be conducted by such licensee.

Section 605.130 Change of Location — Non-Transferable to Another Person. [Code 1985, §52.110; CC 1990 §12-38]

- A. A license may be amended to authorize the conduct of the same business or manufacturing at a different location, provided the control of same remains in the same person or business entity, upon filing with the City Clerk an amended application, within fifteen (15) days of the change, showing the change of address and upon paying a fee of one dollar (\$1.00). It shall also be compulsory that Subsection 605.100(B) 605.070.3 be complied with in respect to the new location and premises.
- B. A license issued to any person under the provisions of this Chapter shall not be transferable from one person to another person in the event of a change of ownership.

Section 605.140 Procedure When There Is More Than One Business at Same Address. [Code 1985, §52.120; CC 1990 §12-39]

Whenever any person making an application for a license under the provisions of this Chapter is engaged in more than one (1) business, which are not operated as a separate legal business entity, at the same address, such person shall combine the information for all businesses conducted at the same address, as required for the purpose of determining the license fee, the same as if all were conducted as a single business operation.

Section 605.160 Fees for Business and Manufacturers of All Kinds. [Code 1985, §52.140; CC 1990 §12-41]

, every person engaged in a business (excluding those exempted by Section 71.620, RSMo., as amended, and as set forth in Section 605.030), shall procure and pay for a license based upon the following: refer to the comprehensive fee schedule for the business or trade of any kind.

Section 605.165 Outdoor Advertising Structures — License Fee. [Ord. No. 1319 §1, 4-24-2000]

The City of Grain Valley, after submitting to the voters of the City and receiving their approval, does hereby adopt a business tax to regulate outdoor advertising structures equal to two percent (2%) of the gross annual revenues derived from the operation of each outdoor advertising structure within the City.

Section 605.170 **Refunds Prohibited.** [Code 1985, §52.150; CC 1990 §12-42]

No claims for refund shall be allowable under this Chapter.

Section 605.180 **False Statements in Applications.** [Code 1985, §52.160; CC 1990 §12-43]

- A. No person shall knowingly make a false statement in his/her application for a license as to any conditions or factors upon which the license fee is or shall be based.
- B. Any person found making a false statement in his/her application for a license, or knowingly making a false statement as to any condition or factor upon which the license fee is or shall be based, the effect of which was or would be to reduce the amount of such fee, shall in addition to all other penalties now provided by law, pay to the City Clerk, upon demand therefor, the additional amount of license fee found to be due, plus a penalty of twenty-five percent (25%) of such additional fee together with interest on the additional license fee of one percent (1%) per month, after the date when the original license fee was due and payable; and any license theretofore issued to any such person shall be subject to suspension or revocation if so determined by the Board of Aldermen.

# Section 605.190 **Suspension, Revocation.** [Code 1985, §52.170; CC 1990 §12-44]

- A. The Board of Aldermen shall have the power to suspend or revoke any license granted under the terms and provisions of this Chapter whenever it shall be shown, or whenever they have knowledge that a licensee is conducting said business or manufacturing in violation of any ordinance of the City. The Board of Aldermen shall have the power to issue subpoenas and all necessary processes and to require the production of papers, to administer oaths and to take testimony and to make findings thereon.
- B. The Board of Aldermen shall not suspend any license issued under this Chapter for a period in excess of sixty (60) days.
- C. Where the action of suspension or revocation is to be taken pursuant to this Chapter, the licensee shall have five (5) days written notice of the Board of Aldermen's intention to suspend or revoke the license prior to the hearing on such suspension or revocation. Such written notice shall be directed by certified or registered U.S. Mail to the business address of the licensee on such licensee's application on file in the office of the City Clerk and shall specify the grounds upon which the license is sought to be suspended or revoked.
- D. The licensee shall have full right to be represented by counsel at such hearing, to produce witnesses in his/her behalf, and any such hearing, as herein provided, shall be before the Board of Aldermen.

# Section 605.200 Violations, Penalties. [Code 1985, §52.180; CC 1990 §12-45]

- A. Any person engaging in any business or manufacturing as herein provided, without first paying the license fee and securing a license therefor, as required by this Chapter or any person violating any other provisions of this Chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to punishment as provided in Section **100.110** of this Code.
- B. Any person violating any order of the Board of Aldermen of suspension or revocation issued pursuant to Section **605.200** by continuing to engage in business or manufacturing during the term of suspension or revocation shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be subject to punishment as provided in Section **100.110** of this Code.

The Board agreed that a training workshop would be helpful and would like to schedule prior to the January 15, 2020 meeting.


